

May the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ be blessed – the compassionate Father and God of all comfort. This was so that we would have confidence in God, who raises the dead, instead of ourselves. God rescued us from a terrible death, and God will rescue us. We have set our hope on God that God will rescue us again, since you are helping with your prayer for us. Then many people can thank God on our behalf for the gift that was given to us through the prayers of many people.
